Register: Giving name and address. Write your name on the small card then pin it on your coat. Keep score on the score card

As soon as you are ready to play, draw the name of your opponent at the Drawing box. Only games played with members of the other Clubs will count. Do not play a member of your own Club! Play only one game with each player. Upon completing a game report your scores and draw another opponent.
Draw games count $\frac{1}{2}$ Stale-Mates count $\frac{1}{2}$

Rules:

Choose color in customary manner. Touches pieces must be played. move is completed when hand is removed. On all moves "boards played". i.e. no move can be retracted. Do not take too long to complete a move, a time limit for planning and executing a play shall be not over three minutes. Castling permitted on either side. Person winning the greatest number of points will be awarded the "King Prize". Person winning next highest number of points will be awarded "QUEEN Prize". Be sure to have score card punched and recarded after each game.

Score will also be kept for the club Units and the Club having the highest score will be recorded as winning the Session.

Games will start at ten O'clock A.M
Games will cease at 1:45 P.M.
