BOZEMAN, MONTANA

APRIL, 11-12, 1942

Forty-one chess players representing eleven Montana communities participated in the Eighth Annual Montana State Chess Tournament held at the Hotel Baxter, Bozeman, April 11 and 12, 1942.

Play in the A Class preliminaries began at 3 o'clock P. M. April 11 with four grows of four constants playing a round-robin tournament within their group. Play in these preliminary sections continued Saturday evening, the last game finishing at 2 o'clock A. M. Sunday. Informal play between B and C Class players was also held during the Saturday session and a light lunch was served Baturday evening for all entrants.

Play was resumed Sunday morning at 10 o'clook A. M. for the Championship flight in Class A and the B and C class tournaments.

At 1:30 o'clock P. M. the annual banquet and business meeting of the Montana State Chess Association was held in the Baxter Hotel dining room. Minutes of the meeting follow:

Douglas Graham, bozeman, president of the State Association, called the meeting to order and welcomed the constants. He then appointed Judge Lowndes Maury, Butte, as toastmaster. The selection of the 1943 Tournament site was the first order of business. C. E. Colegrove, Great Falls, suggested Great Falls. M. J. Greenshields, Big Timber, proposed big Timber. It was moved and seconded that Big Timber's offer be accepted and the motion was carried unanimously. M. J. Greenshields was nominated Association President for 1943 and unanimously elected. As his first act as executive he appointed Charles W. Campbell secretary-treasurer for the coming year.

A cash collection was then taken to aid the 1943 Tournament committee to defray expenses. At the suggestion of George Pierce, Billings, a round-robin letter was made greeting Major J. Van-Tylingen who was unable to attend the 1942 tourney. Van Tylingen, formerly of Great Falls, and one of the leading figures in Montana chess, is now serving with the United States Army.

There being no further business the meeting was adjurned.
