**Johannes VanTeylingen,
Prominent Architect, Dies**

Johannes VanTeylingen, 64, 2220 1st Ave. S., senior partner in the firm of VanTeylingen, Knight &

VanTeylingen, architects, and a local resident for more than 25 years, died Tuesday night at a local hospital where he had been under treatment for a month. Funeral arrangements are pending at the George Co.

VanTeylingen was born Nov. 19, 1891, at Rotterdam, Netherlands. During his career in Great Falls he designed many of the city's principal buildings and was associated in designing many other structures in the state.

Some of the projects with which he was associated in-

clude the Civic Center, Medical Arts Building, Great Falls High School, Butte High School, an addition at the State Hospital at Warm Springs and a church at Havre.

He was active in Masonic work and was advanced to a 33rd degree Mason in 1941. He was past master of Euclid Lodge No. 58, AF&AM, past venerable master of the Great Falls Lodge of Perfection, past commander of Great Falls Council of Kadosh; a member of Scottish Rite Bodies in Great Falls, Knight Commander of the Court of Honour and proclaimed Inspector General, honorary, after being instituted as a 33rd degree Mason in 1941.

A veteran of World War II, VanTeylingen was appointed a major with the U.S. Army Engineer Corps in 1942. He later worked in Greece and other European countries with UNRRA as rehabilitation engineer.

VanTeylingen was elected vice president of the American Institute of Architects in 1951 and in 1952 was named president of the Montana chapter of that organization.

His major hobby was chess, a game that brought him many honors. In national, international and state competition he won more than six titles.

In 1953 his firm established an office at Havre which is operated by a son, Andres VanTeylingen.

Survivors include the widow, Ruth, Great Falls; the son, two grandsons, and several nieces and nephews.

The annual business meeting of the Montana Chess Association was held Saturday evening, May 12, 1956, following a banquet at the Turf Penthouse restaurant in Billings. President M.H. Von Hess called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m...

STATE Representative James R. Felt formally welcomed the members as guests of the Billings Chess Club and the city of Billings. The Billings Secretary made a short report of the tournament receipts and expenditures. Mr. H.L. Maury of Butte generously contributed \$10.00 toward the expenses of the current tournament, which exceeded receipts by \$24.60. For details, please see attached statement.

Mr. Herbert A. Wendel of Butte then moved that the 1957 tournament and business meeting be held in Butte. The motion was seconded and carried. Dr. Adam Smith and Mr. Wendel were elected association president and secretary, respectively, for the coming year. The business meeting was adjourned.

Gerald Moore took charge as master of ceremonies and called on several members in long standing for a series of short talks on chess, highlighted by a sparkling salute to the Grand Old Game by Mr. Maury.
