Games not complete in allotted time-- see schedule, last page--will be adjourned, and considered draws for the purpose of next round pairings. Adjourned games to be completed later if time allows.

Time Limits--Championship class only: 45 moves in the last two hours 25 moves per hour thereafter.

Players may pick their own class. Juniors may elect to play in one of the other classifications.

3 Classes: Championship--Entry fee \$2.00 Class A --Entry fee \$2.00 Junior (under 16) no entry fee.

Open to all players, regardless of residence or membership in any chess organization.



To all Chess Players:

The 23rd annual Montana Chess Tournament will be held in Great Falls, Montana, on Saturday and Sunday, May 3rd and 4th, at the DeMolay Building, 801 2nd Ave. North.

The tournament will be conducted on three different levels:

- (1). The championship class.
- (2). Class A, for those who do not wish to match moves with players in the championship class.
- (3). Juniors, under 18 years of age, who do not wish to enter either of the other classes.

Subject to any modification which maybe necessary due to limited entries, all three classes will be five round Swiss System events, with ties broken by S-B points. In case S-B points are also tied, co-champions will be recognized.

Entry fees for championship and "A" classes, \$2.00.

No entry fee for Junior tournament.

Prizes--trophies for first two places in each group.

Time limits--Championship group only, 45 moves in the first two hours, 25 moves per hour thereafter.

In this connection we wish to note that the resources of the Great Falls Chess Club will not provide a sufficient number of chess clocks for all games in the championship class. If you plan on attending this tournament, even in one of the classes not using clocks, and have a chess clock of your own or one you can borrow, we will appreciate having you bring it along.

The annual dinner and business meeting of the Montana State Chess Association will be held at 6:00 P.M. Saturday, May 3rd, also at the DeMolay Memorial Building--not over \$2.50 per plate, with all players, their friends, and families welcome.

While this is called a Montana State Chess Tournament, we wish to emphasize that it is not limited to Montana residents. In the past we have enjoyed competition from our neighboring states, and from the Canadian Provinces to the north, and sincerely hope we may welcome these visitors again. Hotel accommodations are available within five or six blocks of the DeMolay Memorial, and there are numerous motels slightly farther out for those of you who prefer them. And if you should be traveling by train or plane, we will endeavor to provide transportation to the tournament rooms.

Lest you forget--we will try to write again, about three weeks before tournament time.

Moved and seconded that the nominations be closed. Carried.


The Secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Hanson.
