#### TO ALL CHESS PLAYERS:

The 28th Annual Tournament of the Montana Chess Association will be held in Kalispell, Montana, Saturday and Sunday April 27 and 28, 1963. Registration and all games will be conducted in the Community Room of the First National Bank, all interested Chess Players are welcome to attend and participate.

Championships will be decided in three classes with trophies being awarded to First and Second Place winners in each division:

- 1. CLASS "A" (above average players and previous winners of Class B event)
- 2. CLASS "B"
- 3. JUNIOR CLASS (under eighteen years of age)

A five round Swiss System tournament will be played. A time period of  $4\frac{1}{2}\mathrm{hrs}$ . (approximately) will be allotted for each game. Play will be at the rate of 50 moves in the first 2 hours and 25 moves per hour thereafter. Games not decided in the allotted time will be adjourned and considered as draws for pairings in the next round, but may be finished later if time permits, otherwise games will be adjudicated.

An entry fee of \$2.00 will be charged for the Class "A" and "B" events, no charge to Junior Class entrants. The annual dinner meeting of the Montana Chess Association is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. Saturday evening in the Buffalo Dinning Room of the Montana Hotel. The charge for this dinner is \$2.00 a plate. Wives, Husbands and family members or guests are welcome.

MONTANA CHESS ASSOCIATION 28TH ANNUAL MEETING KALISPELL, MONTANA APRIL 27TH & 28TH, 1963

The Annual Dinner was held in the Buffalo Room of the Montana Hotel, Kalispell, Montana. Attended by 48 members and guests.

The meeting was opened by Dr. A. V. Swanberg, 1963 President of the M. C. A. Dr. Swanberg welcomed the participants to Kalispell, and introduced the State and Kalispell officers, and Gerald Cole, 1963 tournament director.

Dr. Swanberg announced there were 14 Class "A", 22 Class "B" and 11 Juniors for a total of 47 contestants registered for the 1963 tournament. Towns were represented by the following numbers; MISSOULA 5, BUTTE 4, GLASGOW 4, HELENA 3, GREAT FALLS 3, BILLINGS 2, DEER LODGE 2, COLUMBIA FALLS 1, DRUMMOND 1, HUNGRY HORSE 1, MOSCOW, IDAHO 1, SOA PAULO, BRAZIL 1, TACOMA, WASHINGTON 1, and KALISPELL 17.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The 1963 Treasurers report was read and discussed, at the time of discussion it was incomplete due to further expenses, of printing and mailing the tournament results.

Dr. Swanberg suggested adoption of the new M. C. A. emblem, designed by Vern Wyman and used on the 1963 tournament programs, as the official Montana Chess Association emblem to be displayed prominently at all future State Tournaments. After discussion it was accepted. Plans will be made to have the emblem enlarged and embroidered on material. Mr. Barto's niece Betty Cook, offered to do the sewing.

On behalf of the Kalispell Chess Club, Vern Wyman displayed a  $9\frac{1}{2}$  inch mahogany Chess King turned on a lathe by his father, Harold Wyman. He then presented it to the M. C. A., to be used as a traveling trophy, given each year to the town (with two or more players) having the highest player average (total of all game scores divided by the number of all players in the "A" and "B" class combined, from the same town).

Dr. Swanberg on behalf of the American Medical Association and Medicare donated a bottle of Emprin Coumpound, for use of the participants.

Mr. John Barto requested consideration of Great Falls as the 1964 tournament city. A motion was made by Ralph Hansen of Missoula, seconded by Dr. Adam Smith of Butte, that Great Falls be the host city for the 29th annual Montana Chess Association tournament, carried.

Mominations were then made for President and Sec. Treas.
Mr. Grove Dutton of Great Falls was elected President and John Barto elected
Secretary Treasurer, also of Great Falls. Mr. Barto declined nomination
for president and nominated Mr. Dutton, he then graciously accepted the
nomination and election as Sec. Treas.

It was mentioned in the Treasurers report that the Kalispell Club planned to add \$25 to the \$75 received from the Butte Club, and turn over \$100 to the Association for next year.

Mr. Reddy of Helena suggested that something useful be done for the Association with the surplus funds instead of accumulating a large balance. General discussion followed.

Mr. Spaulding of Helena moved that each year the host club not make a donation, just try to break even and not increase the funds. Much discussion followed and the motion was reworded several times.

Dr. Malison of Butte suggested the contributions be voluntary, until the fund reached \$200 or \$250.

It was then suggested in principle that the clubs be left to their own descretion as to whether they wanted to add to the fund or not. It was pointed out by Dr. Swanberg that in years to come situations may vary and that perhaps no hard and fast rule would be better. This principle was agreed upon after further discussion, and no other action was taken.

President Swanberg then presented some second round instructions. Mr. Cole asked for and received permission to start some clocks at 9:00 istead of 8:30 to allow for church services.

With Mr. Hansens motion and Dr. Malison's second the meeting adjourned at 7:20 P. M.
