Billings, Montana, will host the 31st Annual Tournament of the Montana Chess Association on Saturday and Sunday, April 30, and May 1, 1966. Registration and games will be conducted at the Northern Hotel.

Championships will be decided in three classes and trophies will be presented to top three players in each class. Classes will be as follows:

- 1. Championship class or Class A -- open to all.
- 2. Class B, intended for players who feel they would be classified lower than A in any of the recognized rating systems, and who do not wish to compete in the championship class. Previous winners of this class must play in the championship class.
- 3. Junior class under 18 years of age or 18 years old.

A five-round Swiss tonmament will be played in all classes, with approximately four hours allotted for each round. Play will be at the rate of fifty moves in the first two hours, and twenty-five moves per hour thereafter. Games not decided in the allotted time will be adjourned and considered as draws for the purpose of the next round pairings and will be completed later if time permits. Games will be adjudicated only if time prevents their completion. The Breaking will be S-B. Solkoff, and Median points, in that order.

An entry fee of \$5.50 will be charged for Championship and Class B and \$1.50 for Junior Class. Entry fee includes Saturday nite dinner for Adults and Sunday buffet luncheon for adults and juniors. Juniors desiring to be included in the Saturday nite dinner meeting must pay an additional \$3.00 for their dinner.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE MONTANA STATE CHESS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

MAME

The name of this organization shall be the "Montana State Chess Association".

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purposes of this organization are:

- (A) To promote the popularity of the same of chess in Montana.
- (B) To encourage the formation of local chess clubs in Montana.
- (C) To conduct a state championship tournament each year in a host city.
- (D) To elect officers who will ensure the existence of a tournament each year.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Any person may become a member of the organization upon payment of the annual dues.
- 2. In the event that any member of the organization should be guilty of conduct which in the judgement of three-fourths of the membership shall tend to bring the game of chess into disrepute, his membership may be revoked.

ARTICLE IV

ORGANIZATION

- The officers of the association shall be a president, vice-president, secretary-treasurer, and five directors.
- 2. The past president shall be one of the five directors.
- 3. The four remaining directors shall serve 4 year non-concurrent terms.
- 4. Should a vacancy occur, it shall be filled by a majority vote of the membership of the organization at its annual meeting.

ARTICLE V

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- 1. The president shall:
 - (a) Preside at all meetings of the association.
 - (b) Preside at all meetings of the officers of the association.
 - (c) Be responsible for the organization of the annual tournament.
 - (1) Appoint all committees.
- 2. The vice-president shall:
 - (a) Assist the president.
 - (b) Preside at all meetings in the absent of the president.
- 3. The secretary-treasurer shall:
 - (a) Keep the mintues of all meetings.
 - (b) Carry on the correspondence of the club.
 - (c) Collect all authorized dues.
 - (d) Deposit all funds received by him with a bank designated by the officers of the association.
 - (e) Make disbursements as authorized by the officers of the association.
 - (f) Prepare a financial statement for presentation at the annual meeting.

DIRECTORS

- (a) Advise the president.
- (b) Accept any portfolio the president might assign them.

OFFICERS

- (a) Organize and hold a general meeting each year concurrent with the annual tournament.
- (b) Mail to the membership the final standing of the annual tournament each year.
- (c) Present to the membership proposals for changes to the by-laws and constitution each year.

ARTICLE VI

DUES

Association

The annual dues for membership in the club shall be 25ϕ .

ARTICLE VII

MEETING

- 1. There shall be an annual meeting of the membership of the association concurrent with the annual tournament.
- 2. The officers may meet at any time and any place upon call of the president or his alternate.
- 3. One director, the president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer shall be elected and any other vacancies filled at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

AMENDMENTS

This constitution or by-laws may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote of the entire membership.
