Prior to 1951 the financing of the yearly tournaments was largely the problem of the host club-as it still is. At the end of each tournament a collection was taken from the players present, and the proceeds passed on the the host club for the following year. Since the tournaments inevitably showed a deficit, the host club made up the difference, and the club responsible for the next years tournament started again, with the proceeds of a collection.

Under these circumstances the finincial records were naturally rather sketchy, since no funds of the Montana Chess Association were involved, and the records are of small help to a Chess Club planning a tournament

In 1951 the Butte Chess Club very generously donated all the entry fees from the tournament to the Montana Chess Association, as the start of a fund to help finance future tournaments. Since the finincial records are more complete--and it is to be hoped more useful--after this date this summary has been broken at this point and continued on the following pages. More complete data can of course be found by referring to the yearly finincial reports in the Minutes book.

Since its inception the fund has had its ups and downs, but to date (1968) has never been completely depleted.
