TO ALL CHESS PLAYERS:

The Montana State University Chess Club will host the 34th Annual Tournament of the Montana Chess Association on Saturday, April 19 and Sunday, April 20, 1969, at the Bozeman Hotel, Bozeman, Montana.

Championships will be decided in the following classes:

1. Championship (Class A)--open to all. Trophies to top three players.
2. Class B--open to those not wishing to compete in Class A. Previous winners in this class must compete in Class A. Trophies to top two players.
3. Junior Class--limited to players under 18 years old on the opening day of the tournament. Trophies to top two players.

A 5-round Swiss tournament will be held in each class. Time control will be held in each class. Time control will be 50 moves in 2 hours and 25 moves per hour thereafter. All games must be recorded. Games not completed before the next round will be adjourned with a sealed move and considered as draws for the purpose of next round pairing, and will be completed at the earliest convenient time during the tournament. Tie-breaking will be median, Solkoff, and S-B points in that order.

An entry fee of \$3.00 for A and B Classes, and \$1.50 for Junior class may be paid either in advance by mail or during registration. The annual dinner meeting will be held at the Bozeman Hotel Saturday evening, April 19, 1969. All players, their relatives, and friends are welcome at the cost of \$3.00 per plate.



The meeting was called to order by President Dan Rodgers.


A discussion was held concerning possible affiliation with the Northwest Chess Association. After the discussion, a vote was taken with 18 members against affiliation and 5 members for.

## Montana Chess Champs Named

Dr. Peter Lapiken of Missoula is the new chess champion of Montana after his five straight victories over the weekend in the 1969 Montana Open Chess Tournament here at Montana State University.

The new Class B champion is Tai Hum of Butte, a student at Montana Tech, who also won five straight.

Junior Class titlist is Dave Holzworth, Helena.

Taking second behind Dr. Lapiken was retiring president of the Montana Chess Association, Dan Rogers, an MSU chemistry student. Dimitry Berkoff, MSU Russian lecturer, was third.

Bozeman's Dave Loy, also an MSU student, took second over 16 others in Class B on tie-breaker points.

Roger Reichert, Great Falls, was second in the Junior Class. Only four players competed.

Defending State Champion Ed McCaskey, MSU graduate geology student, finished fourth in Class A.

The meet was hosted by the MSU Chess Club.

Elected MCA president for next year was Dirk Duykers, Butte, and as secretary Gary Wendel, also of Butte. Next year's meet will be held in the Mining City.
