Judson Temple scored $2\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ following the Copper King's Open to close out his match against Doug Klaucke with a $7\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$ total. As Judson is moving to a suburb of Detroit, MI, this marks the end of a tremendously successful 16 months of Montana Chess Results, including 6 Rated Tournament wins, 3 Seconds, a 6th, and two Match victories.

Marc Lynn scored $3\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ in a 4RSS Open Tournament in Casper, Wyoming, January 14-15, to stand alone in first place. Wyoming Champion Steve Smith was second at 3-2.
