Tony Mattina's 4½ points gave him undisputed 2nd place and Herman Chiu won 3rd on tie break with a score of 4. Best under 1600 went to Dave Shughart of Missoula with a score of 4. Best under 1400 and best under 1200 went to Doug Brock (3 pts) and Richard Johnston (2 pts), respectively. In the beginners section, Jim Knudtson of Missoula prevailed over each of 5 other competitors to win with a perfect score.

Britt-Stubberud RD5 BD1 DUTCH DEFENSE
 Dan gives up a Knight (and a fianchettoed position never occupied by a Bishop) for the attack on a much weakened Black Kingside. The passed pawn which is created on move 18 proves to be Kip's undoing, for by move 28 he is down substantially in material and is in perilous straits. Dan returns some of the material in exchange for an irresistible attack. Petrak-Mattina RD5 BD2 ENGLISH FOUR KNIGHTS? This has the look of a reversed Queen's Gambit. Tony illustrates the technique of guarding a threat and

restoring material on move 11. The middlegame sees Black warding off threats by creating some of his own--a task made easier by the exposed White Queen. Black makes good use of the open lines, winning a full piece on move 21. He handles his Queen well on the mostly open board forcing exchanges, keeping the piece and creating a passed pawn (2 of them--connected--by move 29). Stubberud-Chiu RD4 BD1 KING'S INDIAN DEFENCE Black sacrifices Pawns to open the Queenside with initial strong attack. But, after Kip castles Kingside, he has a slight advantage due to the greater centralization of pieces along with the counter weight of two Rooks on the Queenside. The early maneuvering leaves Black with nothing gained and he must retreat when White makes the break, winning a whole piece by move 20. In severe time trouble, Black (not White, you will note!!!) can do little and White merely consolidates his position. Black's last aggressive moves are no compensation for weakened back rank where unavoidable mate is threatened, so Black resigns. (Note: despite this loss, Herman Chiu exhibited fine play and readily bested all of his other opponents. Chiu-Shughart RD1 BD1 QUEEN'S GAMBIT DECLINED (by transposition) Black infiltrates early to capture a Rook, but the Knight is trapped. When it does get captured on move 16, White is a piece and a Pawn up (more when you consider Black's ripped Pawn structure). White deftly spreads a mating net while the Black Queen engages in Pawn snatching that represents no counter threat. Black resigns. Brock-White RD1 BD8 IRREGULAR KING PAWN Both sides have trouble finding good squares for their Bishops, so the loss of time is balanced. White (color, not player) gives a nice illustration of discovered attack and simplification. When the Rooks cease playing at Pac Man on the 7th, each side has a passed Pawn, but the White side has more material. The game goes on for another 20 moves, but Black resigns.
