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Mike Jensen repeated his perfect score in the Valentine Open in Missoula, including wins over Kip Stubberud and Jim Loy, to fashion the best start ever on the Montana tournament circuit and grab the early lead in the 1983 Grand Prix running. John Hay slipped into second place on tie-breaks with 4.0, losing only to Jensen. A complete crosstable and the featured games will appear next issue.

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Matt Guthrie captured the 1982 Montana Grand Prix Title with 43 points, despite missing the last three tournaments of the year. Kip Stubberud bagged three points in the final event of the year to edge out Jim Loy for second place with 31 points to Jim's 30. Mike Jensen came fourth with 20 points while Dan Britt and Wyoming's Marc Lynn tied for 5-6 places with 17 each. Other top scorers were: 7 Stewart Sutton - 10; 8 Andy Shuck - 8½; 9-10 Tony Mattina, Bill Lynch - 8; 11 Ken Shinn - 7; 12-15 Derrick Watson, Jim Chester, Tim O'Conner, Herman Chio - 5.

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Jim Loy sent a report showing that Don Lester and Daryn Bundtrock tied with Rex Moats at 4-1 and qualified on tie breaks to win the MSU Intermural Chess Tournament and will go to The ACU-I Regionals at Mt. Hood College in Oregon on Feb. 18-19 to represent MSU. The intermural event drew 18 players - none of whom are currently involved in rated chess play in the state. Hopefully we'll be seeing some of them around soon.

This was a strong tournament with Matt Guthrie returning from Princeton (he couldn't stay for the last round) and Mike Jensen who is now pushing candidate master. Dave Leppert is a new player who achieved a provisional rating of 1914 in his first tournament. Such strength was the cause of some low scores posted by good players.
