Dan Britt of Missoula was the best player under 1600 with 3½, Matt Janke took a silver medal home to Bozeman for the best under 1400, and Missoula's Paul Zylawy picked up the bronze for the best performance by an under 1200 player.

It is the end of the last round and each side has promoted a Pawn and White has one more Pawn taking for a very demanding Queen and Pawn ending. But, he loses his Queen giving check. He evidently thought a Pawn actually going the other direction was supporting the Queen. After two days of chess who hasn't had their eyes play tricks on them?
